

#### What is MyPath?

MyPath is a national non-profit that helps youth and young adults bank, save and build their credit. Because we understand that banking can sometimes be intimidating or confusing for young people, MyPath strives to improve the banking system to create more youth friendly policies. MyPath has two groups of Youth Leaders (MyPath Advocates and MyPath Innovators) who help shape our advocacy work and customize our financial curriculum, both of which impact youth across the country.

Youth Leader Programs active <u>July 2017-May 2018</u>
All participants can receive a monthly stipend up to \$100

#### **Youth Programs Description**

MyPath Advocates (Tuesday group): Are community youth leaders who focus on raising awareness about predatory services like Check Cashers. We are currently working on a campaign "Youth Pronounce Accounts". We believe every youth deserves to have access to a SAFE bank account of their own. Being a part of this group, you will learn how to organize a campaign and you will become a very active community leader.

MyPath Innovators (Thursday group): Are peer youth leaders who provide money management and credit presentations to youth in San Francisco youth programs and schools. The Innovators also help create and suggest feedback for all of My Path's curriculum. Being a part of this group, you will learn how to publicly speak and how to facilitate large groups. The Innovators group is a space for creativity and for youth input to keep continuing to improve our financial curriculum.

#### Responsibilities:

- Attend mandatory summer training
   July 12<sup>th</sup> Aug 3rd
   (Stipend when completed)
- Commit to attending after school meetings once a week (4:30 PM – 6:30PM)
   Advocates on Tuesdays Innovators on Thursdays
- Cannot have more than two unexcused absences from the program
- Commit to a minimum of <u>one year</u> in the school year program
- Be an exceptional representative of MyPath

### Program Requirements and Eligibility:

- Be enrolled in a SF High School
- Must have a GPA of 2.5 or higher
- Be willing to be a community leader
- Share your opinions and publicly speak when needed
- Be on time for every meeting
- Demonstrate a great attitude
- Interested in economic justice
